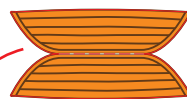

How to build your Mayflower

- Carefully cut-out all the parts.
- Pierce small holes to hold the masts at the points indicated. ⊗
- Fold along all dashed lines.
- Place 3 pieces of blu-tack on the inside of the base where shown. These will be used later to hold the masts in place.
- Glue tabs in number order.
- Pierce holes through the sails (see sheet 2) at the points indicated. ⊗
- Use small wooden kebab sticks (painted brown) as masts and cut to sizes shown on sheet 2.
- Slide the masts through the sails and glue the flags to the top of the masts.
- Place the masts and sails through the deck and into the blu-tack.
- Glue your completed model to the Atlantic Ocean (see sheet 2) and sail away to the new world.

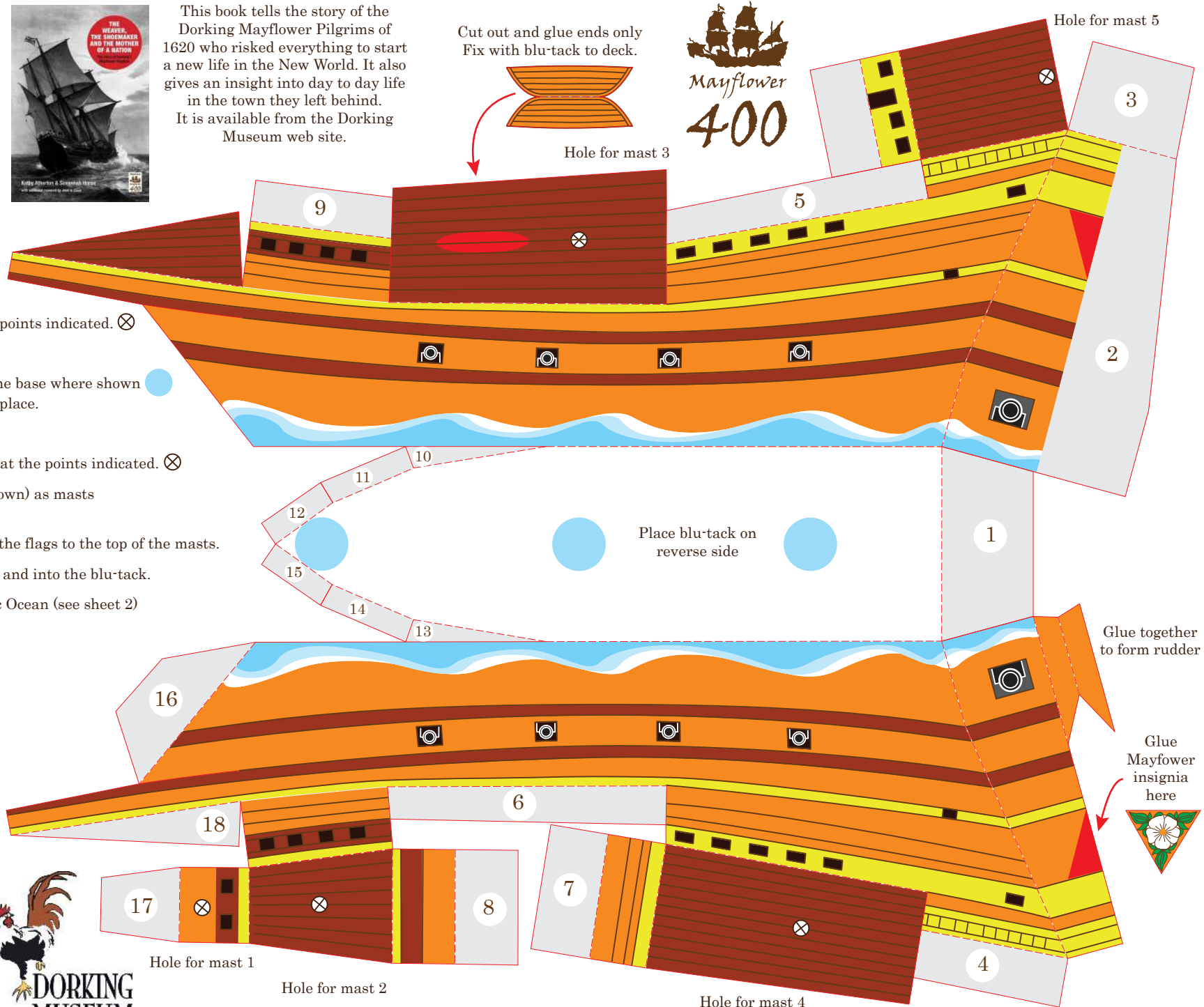

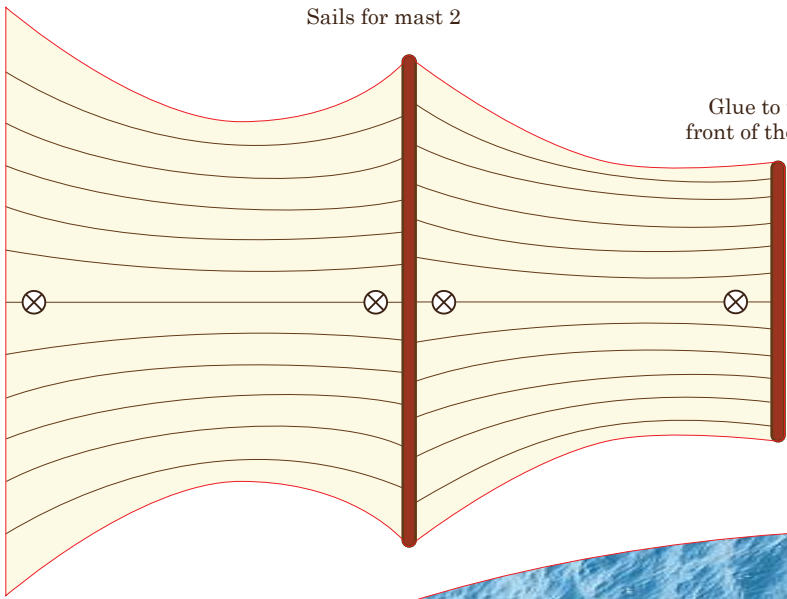

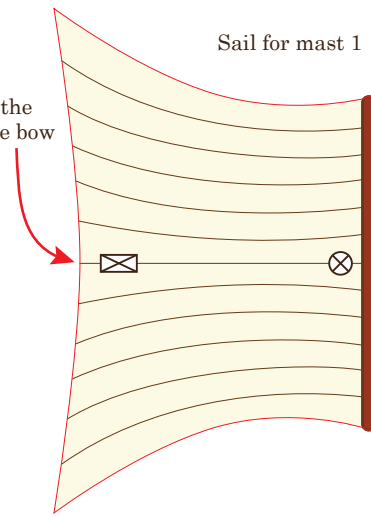

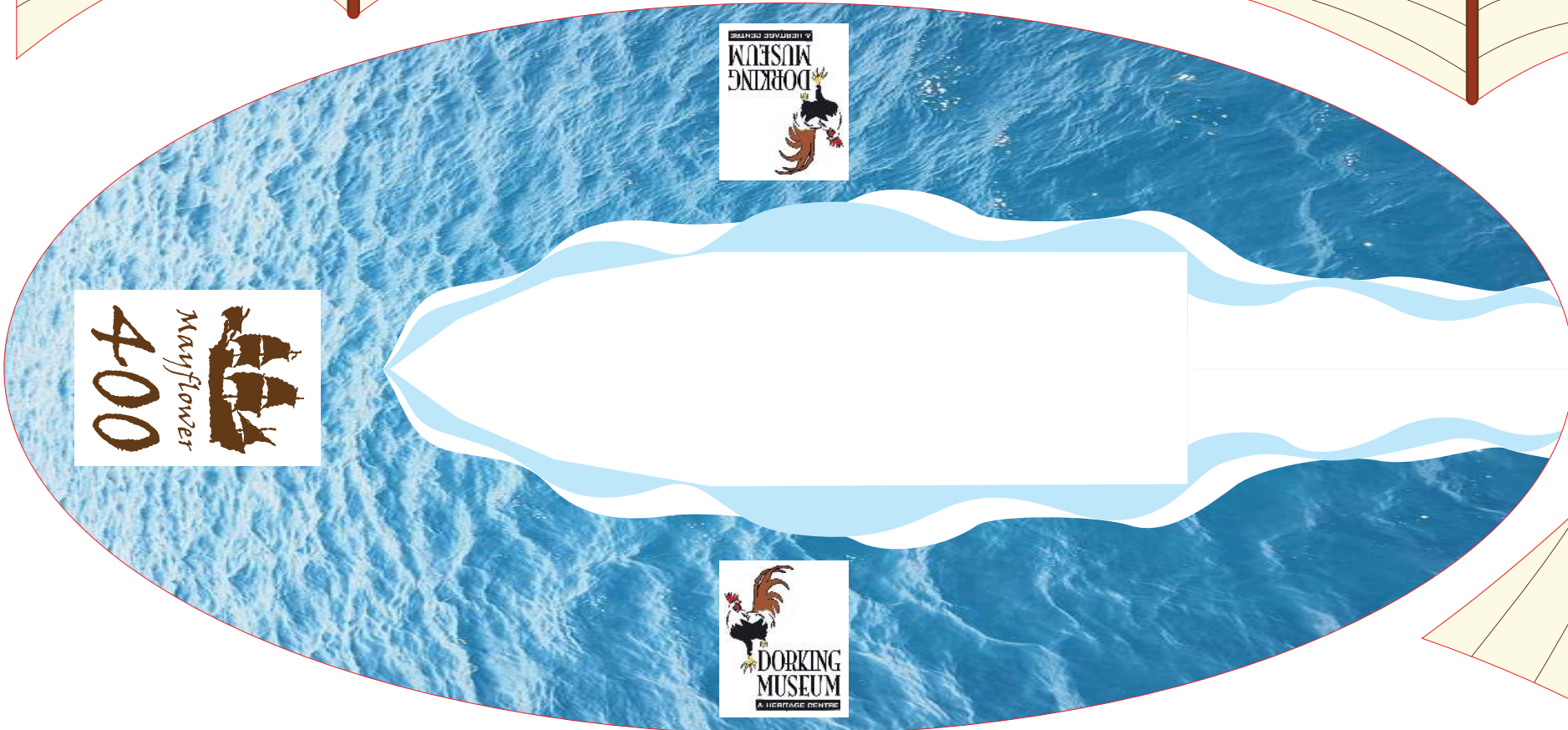
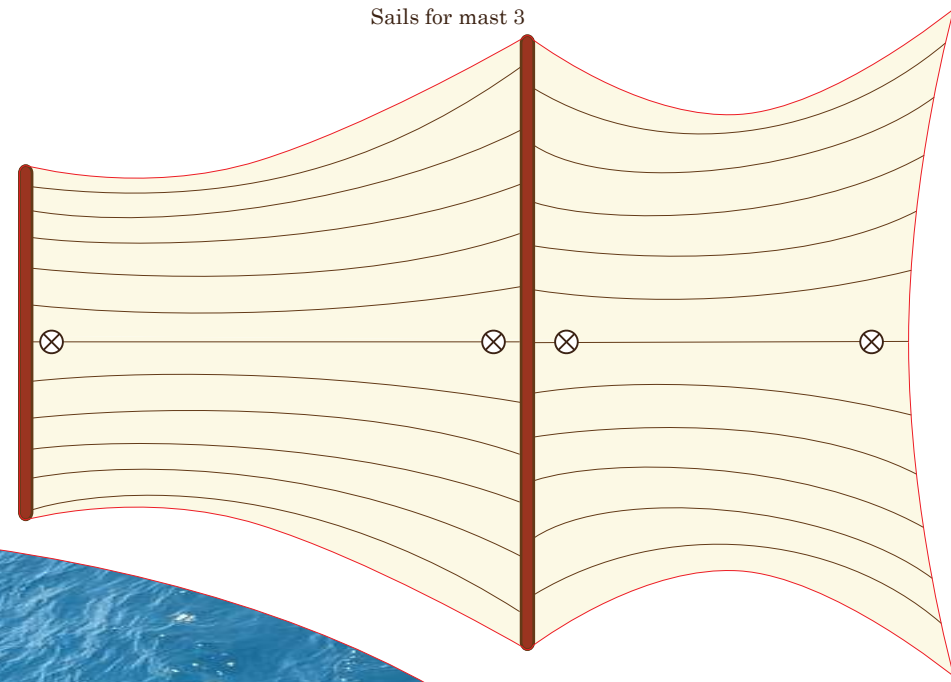


Sail for mast 1

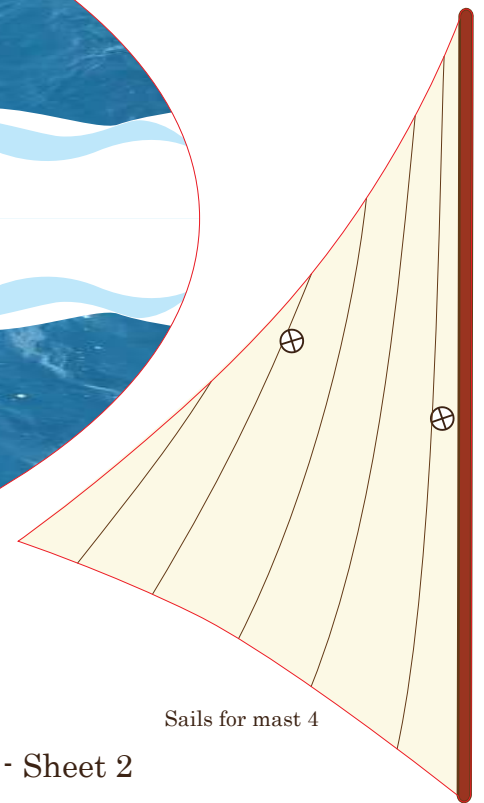
Glue to the front of the bow
